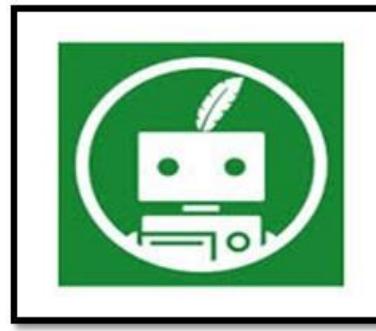
VARIOUS AI TOOLS USED IN LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE TEACHING

4. NoRedInk



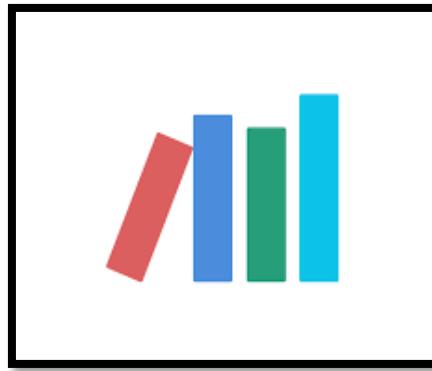

8. WriteLab



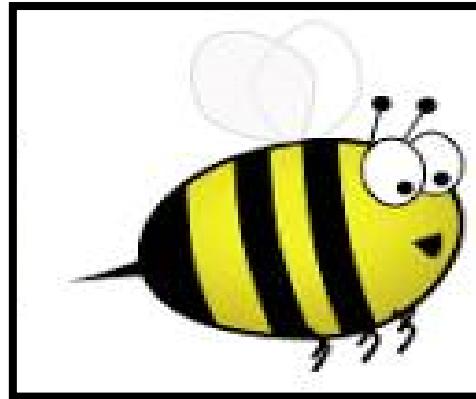

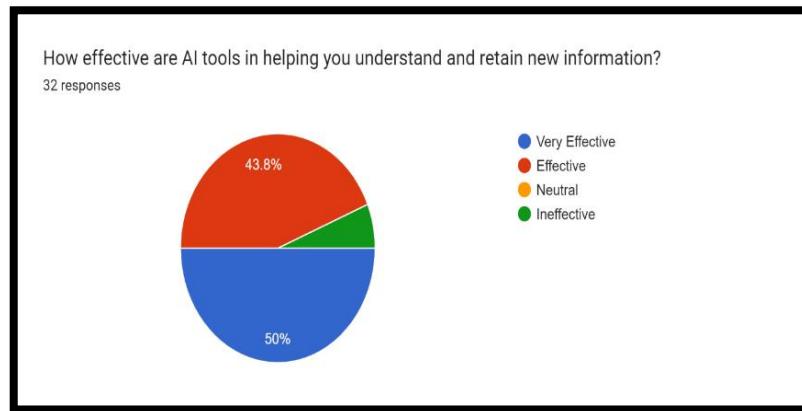
7. Student Support Services

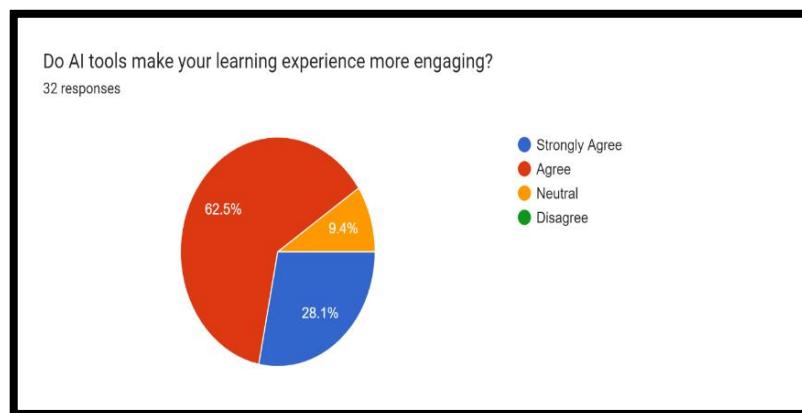
METHODOLOGY

SURVEY AND ANALYSIS



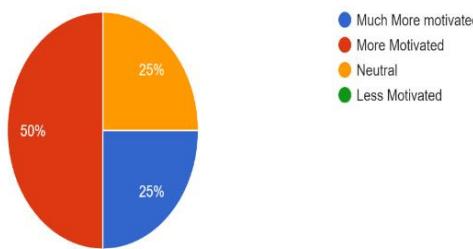
- 50% (16/32) of students feels AI tools **Very Effective** in helping them understand and retain new information.

How motivated are you to use AI tools compared to traditional learning methods?

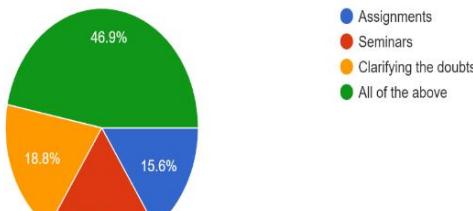

In which area is AI tool much useful for You to cope up with your education?

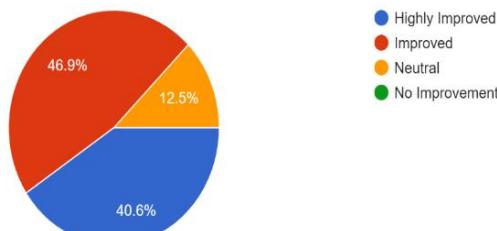

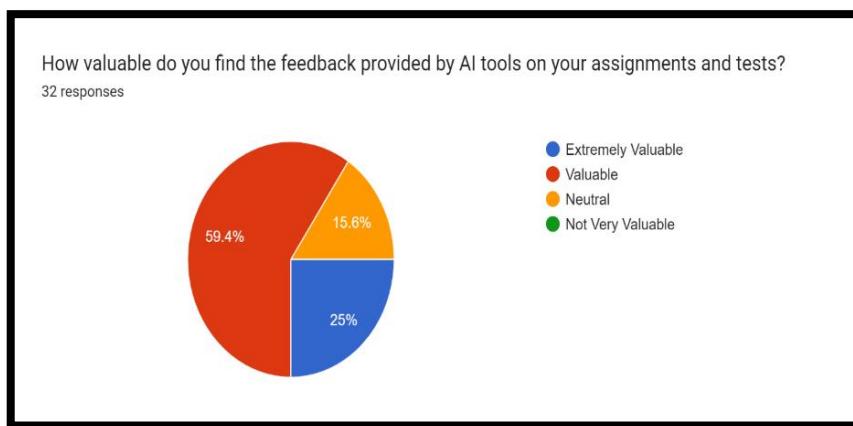
- 15.6% (5/32) of students feel AI tool much useful in making their **Assignments**.

Have AI tools helped improve your grades or understanding of the subject matter?

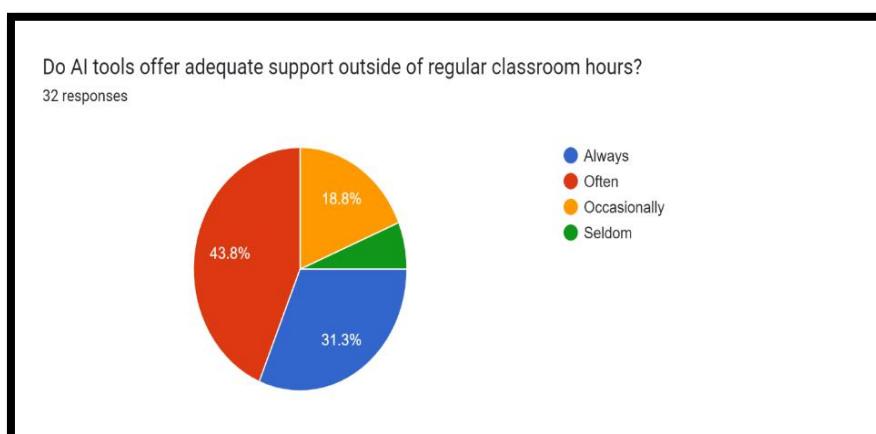

- 12.5% (4/32) of students feel AI Tools had **Neutral** Impact over their grades and Understanding of the subject matter.

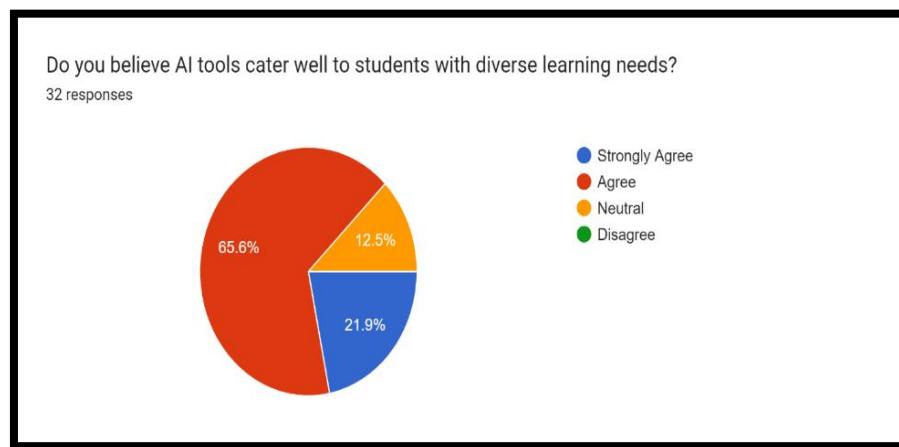


- 25% (8/32) of students feel the feedback **Extreme Valuable** provided by AI Tools on their Assignments and Tests.

- 15.6% (5/32) of students feel the feedback as **Neutral** provided by AI Tools on their Assignments and Tests.

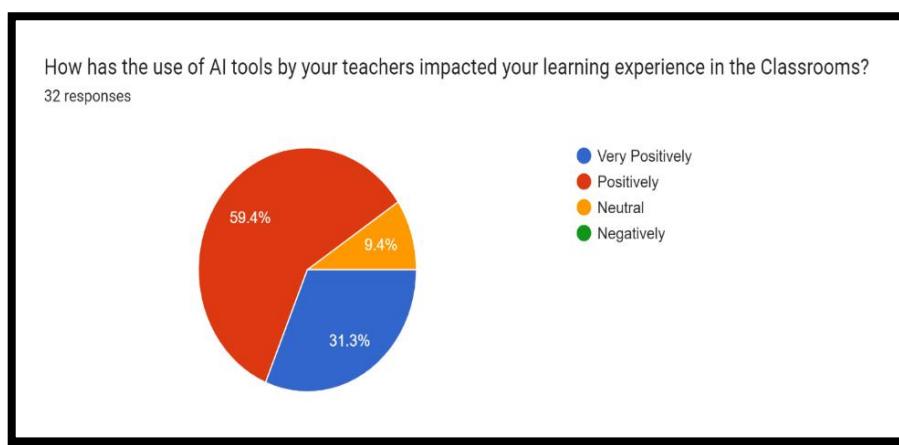


- 31.3% (10/32) of students feel that AI Tools **Always** offer adequate support outside of regular classroom hours.

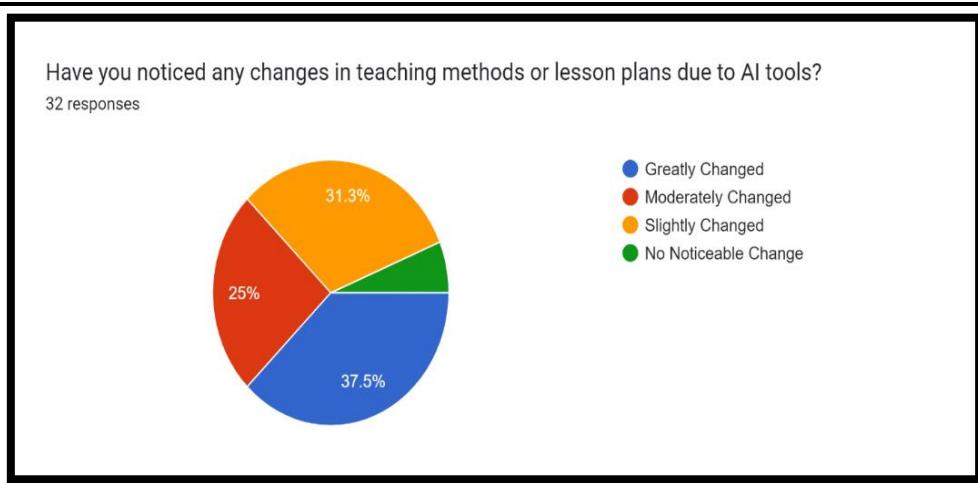
- 18.8% (6/32) of students feel that AI Tools **Occasionally** offer adequate support outside of regular classroom hours.
