Primary area

- Primary Health Centres with 27% and
- Community Health Centres with 28% deficit, as of July 1, 2019.14

The medical services framework in the country region isn't satisfactory to deal with this pandemic and the transmission particularly in the northern states where populace thickness is high a result of specialists' deficiency, medical services offices like exceptionally less accessibility of no. of beds per thousand individuals, gear, etc. (Kumar, Nayar, and Koya, 2020)

Domestic viciousness and wrongdoing

As indicated by the most recent report by National Commission for Women (NCW), inside 25 days following lockdown, there was a 45% increment in the quantity of instances of aggressive behaviour at home against ladies. Aggressive behaviour at home cases have seen an upsurge mostly in provinces of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Haryana and Punjab¹⁵ with a close to multiplying of the cases when contrasted with pre-lockdown cases said NCW boss Rekha Sharma. The genuine circumstance, be that as it may, might be more risky on the grounds that numerous ladies from rustic regions particularly don't record a case and speak loudly and are frightened of their spouses and family (Kundu and Bhowmik, 2020).
